The beach "Mala Makarska"

The major part of the beach is covered with stone tiles, and the rest is covered with small stones and pebbles.

You can enter in the water from concrete piers where the water is deeper, or directly from the beach where the water is very shallow. Sea bottom is covered with stones, pebbles and sand.

Beach facilities: volleyball and basketball playground, shower, changing booths and a toilet.




The famous beach in Sukosan is "Dječji raj" (Children's paradise). It is partly covered with sand and pebbles, and partly covered with stone tiles. Sunbathing and swimming is possible at almost any part of the coast. There's a pine forest near the sea (in direction toward Split), and the beach "Zlatna luka" (Golden harbour) covered with pebbles (in direction toward Zadar).

SUKOŠAN

Sukosan is a town and small harbour in a vast bay (Luka Sukosan), 11 km south-east of Zadar; population 2,500. Main occupations include farming, viniculture, olive growing, fruit growing and tourism.

A name Sukosan or Sanctus Casanus, was mentioned for the first time in one legal document in the year 1289, but the village itself is much older. A medieval settlement has been founded at the bottom of the shallow and sheltered lagoon called Golden Harbour.



Today Sukosan spreads around the entire spacious bay, and the first founded village is just a heart of present developed tourist place.

In the tame landscape of the Sukosan lagoon, on the artificially made small islet, Zadar's archbishop Matheo Valaresso built a summer palace. This palace represents a most significant example of the pastorally architecture of the 15th century. In the time of the ottoman attacks, local inhabitants found a shelter inside the walls of palace. After turbulent war centuries and several earthquakes which hit this region, the palace almost vanished. Only three walls as modest remains of former palace still jut out of the sea, which are most impressive during the summer solstice, when the sun sets down precisely between two walls.



Inside of the former village walls, Sukosan is meshed by the narrow streets surrounded by the old stone-built houses which bear the signs of the former turbulent centuries. In the central part of this medieval village there is the parish church, erected probably in the 11th century, assumed its present aspect in the 17th century, dedicated to the protector of Sukosan - Saint Casanus.

A small church from the 17th century rises on the graveyard. Fragments with "pleter" (interlacy ornament) are incorporated in its door-posts and on the front.

Especially picturesque is the square Gornja vrata with the old villas renovated in charming restaurants and a chapel dedicated to the Virgin Mary. During the summer season, various culture and entertaining performances take place on this square.

Due to its numerous restaurants and taverns, Sukosan is being considered as a place of wine and song!

Sukosan cherishes the old customs. They are linked to the feast of St. Kasijan, the patron saint of Sukosan (13th August).

During the carnival season, "luzari", masks typical only for Sukosan, represent a special attraction.

ZADAR

For centuries the capital city of Dalmatia and today the centre of the region. A city with a rich heritage of world importance, visible at every step. The Roman Forum from the 1st century, St. Donatus' Church from the 9th century is the most famous medieval basilica and trademark of the city. The reconstructed Romanesque St. Grisigono's Church from the 12th century and the St. Mary's bell tower from the year 1105; the St. Anastasia's Cathedral from the 13th century; the People's Square with the City's Lodge and Guardhouse from the 16th century, as well as the mighty fortification walls with first class Sea-farer's and land gates from the 16th century followed by the Three and Five Wells Squares and many palaces, villas and other historic monuments.



The City of Zadar is not only known for its historical and cultural monuments but also for its amply supplied vegetable and fish markets on the peninsula (a part of the old city). The market is daily supplied with fresh fruit and vegetables from the rich hinterland of "Ravni Kotari", the fruitful waters of Lake Vrana and the islands of Ugljan and Pasman.



Its attractiveness is due greatly to its fantastic natural position in the very middle of the Adriatic coast, and to the four National Parks surrounding it: Plitvica Lakes, Paklenica mountain, the unique River Krka waterfalls and a string of wondrous islands called Kornati.

No less attractive are the nature Parks of Telascica, the canyon of the Zrmanja River and the largest natural lake in Croatia – Lake Vrana in the vicinity of Biograd.



EXCURSIONS

Towns



ZADAR

A town in the very heart of the Adriatic, which is often called a "small Croatian Rome". Three thousand years of history, unique sacral buildings and a rich cultural heritage are responsible for this title.



NIN

Nin is the oldest Croatian royal town in which rulers and bishops had their seats from the 7th to the 10th centuries. It was known as Aenona in Roman time and had the forum, amphitheatre and aqueduct. Nin is situated on a small islet in the middle of a shallow lagoon and thus it connects its historical richness with natural beauties.



BIOGRAD NA MORU

A beautiful town of the Zadar Riviera within reach of the enchanting Kornati islands often called "the paradise for boaters" due to its diverse coves and beaches. It is situated on a peninsula with the view to the island of Pašman separated from it by a long channel.



SIBENIK

A city that successfully combines its glorious past with its gift of natural beauty. While sightseeing in this city you will surely be impressed by the well-known cathedral Sv. Jakov, the most important renaissance structure in Croatia.

National parks



KORNATI

Island group National Park, Kornati, is the most indented island group on the whole of Mediterranean with as many as 140 uninhabited islands, islets and cliffs. It is a paradise for nautical experts, modern Robinsons and divers.

Distance from Sukosan: 11 Nm



KRKA

National Park Krka is situated on the most beautiful Croatian karst river Krka. The river represents a sort of karst phenomenon, which, on its way towards the sea, forms numerous lakes, waterfalls and currents. Most impressive and most visited of these are Skradinski buk and Roški waterfall.

Distance from Sukosan: 80 km



PAKLENICA

National Park Paklenica is a small but important part of mountain Velebit including two canyons: Velika and Mala Paklenica. It is one of the most attractive and most beautiful natural phenomena in Velebit that has become worldwide mountaineering attraction.

Distance from Sukosan: 60 km



THE PLITVICE LAKES

Sixteen turquoise mutually interconnected lakes make a unique image created by nature. The lakes decant one into the other through many waterfalls. You can walk around them using numerous bridges and paths or take a romantic boat ride.

Distance from Sukosan: 152 km

Nature parks



LAKE VRANSKO

Lake Vransko is the largest lake in Croatia. Part of it is protected as an ornithological reservation, while the whole lake is proclaimed to be important bird area according to criteria by the European Union.



TELASCICA


Nature Park Telascica is situated on the entrance to National Park Kornati. It consists of a narrow bay with a 100 m high vertical cliff on whose top there is a large salt lake. The northeastern side of the bay is completely stripped of all plants, while the southwestern side is covered in thick pine, olive, and fig forest.



VELEBIT

There are a great number of reasons why Velebit was proclaimed a Nature Park; unusual rocks, canyons, deep pits, caves, and numerous endemic species that inhabit this mountain. From the mountaintops there is a magnificent view over the Adriatic Sea and several islands. In the Park you are welcome to raft on the river Zrmanja, climb, fish and mountaineer.

HOW TO FIND US



When you enter Sukošan, on crossroad "Zadar - Sibenik", turn left (toward Sibenik)
We are about 1400 m away from crossroad, on the right side of the road, across a car wash.

The Republic of Croatia

Surface: 56.542 km²

Foreign currency is freely brought in and taken out of the country; up to a value of 15.000 Kuna for domestic currency.

Dogs and cats, accompanied by their owner, need to have an International certificate from a registered veterinarian stating that at least 15 days and not more than six months have passed since their vaccination against rabies.
